

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About the System

This guide provides information on how to install and configure Honeywell's Galaxy TouchCenter Plus graphical touch-screen keypads, which are Advanced User Interface (AUI) devices. Your system will comprise one of the following keypads and the wall mount plastics:

- CP045-00 Galaxy TouchCenter Plus flush mount
- CP046-00 Galaxy TouchCenter Plus flush mount, with Prox
- A045 Wall mount plastics for Galaxy TouchCenter Plus

Compatibility

The listing below identifies the alarm systems that the keypad can interface with, the maximum number of keypads that can be used with each system, and the minimum alarm panel software revision level for compatibility.



Mounting

This keypad is for indoor use within the protected area only and should be mounted at a comfortable viewing level. Avoid mounting in areas of high condensation such as bathrooms or in locations where bright light or sunlight shines directly on the screen.

To mount the keypad:

- 1. Unclip the facia from the keypad to reveal four mounting screw holes.
- 2. If the customer has supplied an SD/SDHC media card containing videos and/or photos, fit the card in the slot in the rear of the keypad as shown below.
- 3. Cut a hole in the wall 208 x 152 mm (ensure it is no larger than 214 x 158 mm). Ensure there is a depth from the surface of the wall of at least 30 mm. If you need to attach the tamper to the wall to meet EN50131, ensure there is no gap between the rear of the tamper and the wall using suitable packing material.
- 4. Make a hole in the back or sides of the recessed box and feed the RS485 cable through.
- 5. Place the recessed box in the hole and tighten the claw fasteners, which rotate 90 behind the plaster board. Continue tightening until the box is securely held.
- 6. To meet EN50131, screw the tamper in the recessed box to the wall behind the box.
- 7. Go to *Wiring* (page 7) and complete the wiring.
- 8. Locate the keypad over the recessed box and ensure you can hear the tamper switch click, indicating that it is closed. Ensure that the keypad sits flat against the recessed box without the need to apply excessive force. If the keypad won't sit flat against the recessed box or the switch doesn't click, adjust the tamper screw (in to allow the keypad to locate and out

Wiring


Connect the Galaxy TouchCenter Plus to the panel's RS485 terminals. For maximum wire runs and wire sizes, refer to your panel's installation manual.



The keypad draws up to 340mA at 9.6VDC, 260mA at 12VDC and 250mA at 13.8VDC.

If you power the keypad from your panel's auxiliary power output, check your panel's Installation and Setup Guide and verify that this device and others do not exceed your panel's auxiliary power output capability. If it does, use a supplementary power supply.

Connect the RS485 wires to the keypad terminal block as shown below.



SD/SDHC Card Slot and Reset Button

The Galaxy TouchCenter Plus has a media card slot and reset button located behind the panel as shown below. **Note:** If you need to insert a media card or access the reset button remember to do so before securing the keypad in place.



Note: When EN50131 Mode* is enabled the system status line at the top of the keypad is not displayed. *The EN50131 Display compliance feature is a European Standard designed to prevent unauthorized users from viewing the status of the Security System.

Initial Setup

Initial Power Application

When initially powered, the screen displays **TouchCenter Plus** and the loading progress indicator bar.

	ACTION	NOTES
1.	Apply power to the panel, which also powers the Galaxy TouchCenter Plus. TouchCenter Plus is displayed along with the loading progress indicator bar. This is then followed by the Set RS485 Address screen.	Note: The Galaxy TouchCenter Plus has been calibrated at the factory. Ignore the Calibrate button that appears on the Options screen after initial address setup. If the screen requires recalibration, the end user may do so via the Keypad Test screen. See the <i>LCD Display Test</i> section for instructions.
2.	On the Set RS485 Address screen, do one of the following:	
	a) Leave the default address unchanged (the default address is 0).	
	b) Use the up/down arrows to select a new address if 0 is used by another device on the panel.	
3.	Press OK.	
4.	On the next screen, select the required language and, if not required, deselect EN50131 Mode (it is selected by default).	
5.	Click OK . The Home screen is displayed.	
6.	To set the time and date refer to <i>Time/Date Setup</i> .

IP Setup and Network Connections

IP Address Setup

In most cases, IP addresses are assigned automatically (the **Obtain address auto** setting). However, you may require a static (fixed) IP address that can be found by accessing your router. Refer to your router instructions.

Setup

This section describes how to use the brightness and volume controls, and how to select the language and adjust the screen timeouts.

Brightness and Volume Control

To set the brightness and volume:

Setup (cont'd)

Adjust the Screen Timeouts

When the keypad is left idle, it automatically:

- Turns the backlight off after the selected backlight off time has expired (unless the Never option is selected).
- Returns to the **Home** screen after the selected **To Homepage After** time has expired (unless **Never** option is selected), and
- If enabled, the **Auto Slideshow After** time begins the slide show.

Note: In EN50131 Mode you can only adjust the backlight off after time.

To select the desired screen timeouts:

Clean Screen

With the exception of normal cleaning, the keypad is maintenance free. Press the **Display Setup** icon, and do the following:

DO NOT use any liquids, sprays, or ammonia-based cleansers. Press CONTINUE to disable touchscreen. Press Continue, and then wipe the screen. 	When the Continue icon is pressed the message Touch Screen Disabled for =30 Seconds is displayed. During these 30 seconds the touch screen should be wiped clean of fingerprints using a mild soap solution and a soft cloth. When the counter reaches zero, the window automatically closes and the touch screen is active.

IMPORTANT: Do not use an abrasive cleaning agent or abrasive cloth when cleaning the keypad or damage to the touch screen may occur.

Multi-Media

The multi-media options allow you to display personal photos in a slide show format and video (audio) files. **Important:** The feature will only work if you fitted a personal media (SD/SDHC) card with stored photos and /or video (audio) files prior to installing the keypad.

Video (Audio) Setup

This feature allows you to display videos and can be accessed from the **Home** screen by pressing the **Multimedia** icon. To access this function:

The Camera feature allows you to enrol cameras and view up to four cameras at one time using the quadrant view feature. If using existing (mounted) cameras, go to Step 4 below. System Setup

This section describes how to change system settings.

Console Mode

Console Mode displays an alpha/numeric keypad on the screen that can be used to make changes on the panel.

To access the Console Mode:

EN50131 Mode

The EN50131 compliance feature is part of a European Standard designed to prevent unauthorized users from viewing the status of the security system. When **EN50131 Mode** is turned on the status bar is not displayed on the **Home** screen. Follow this procedure if you want to enable/disable **EN50131 Mode**:

Control

The TouchCenter Plus can be used to control building systems such as lighting, air conditioning and gates. To setup control, if required:

	 In the panel, use option 53.XXXX.6 (refer to the panel's Installer Manual) to setup the devices/systems that will be controlled from the keypad. On the keypad, press the Control icon. 	You will see a switch icon for each device/system that can be controlled from the keypad. A lightbulb symbol may be displayed next to a switch if Show Status has been enabled in the panel. The lightbulb symbol changes to lit when the switch icon is pressed.

User System Setup

This section describes how to setup users and user functions.

User PIN Setup

Each user must be assigned a name with a corresponding 4 to 6 digit User PIN in order to gain access to various features and functions.

Users of the system are programmed in a central user setup location in the control panel that provides options to enable various user details.

Authority Levels

Authority levels define the system functions a particular user can perform. Depending on the authority assigned to you, there are certain system functions you may be prohibited from performing. The following information describes the authority levels available in the keypad and provides the equivalent authority level name found in your alarm system manuals. The authority levels available in the keypad are as follows:

Note: All levels except Guard 0 can change their own PIN.

Note: The authorised code level for deleting, adding, and editing users is level 6.

How to Add a User

To add a user:

In the boxes, enter a User Name and a User PIN (4 to 6 digits). Select a User Level. If groups are enabled, select values for the User Groups and Group Choice fields. If required, select Full Menu. If required, add a fob or max card as follows: Press Start Learn card and present the fob/max to the KeyProx reader below the keypad screen. The number will be self- learned onto the system and displayed in the card number window. Press the Save icon. 	 Use the data entry keyboard to enter all required information. User names can have up to 6 characters, including spaces. How to Delete a User

Time/Date Setup

You can set the time and date on the **Time/Date Setup** screen, which also updates the panel's time and date. During normal operation the panel periodically updates the keypad time and date settings.

Setting Current Time and Date

To set the time and date:

Advanced Setup

The Advanced Setup screen provides access to Keypad Test and Keypad Reset screens.

Note: The Night Setup and Output Setup options are not available.

Keypad Test

Keypad test allows you to perform the following four tests: LCD Display Test, Audio Test, LED Test, and Calibration.



Each time you enter the Keypad Test screen the tests are listed as Not Performed.
